Rabbi Jonathan is a bread maker and baking teacher who in 2004 founded "Slice of Heaven Breads," a non-profit, all volunteer charitable bakery that operates out of the kitchen of Temple Sinai. Products are sold to the public, proceeds go to food programs and other charitable causes, and *challah* is provided weekly to nursing home residents, hospital patients and the needy. ۲
