In the winter of 1983, Congregation Berith Sholom in Troy hired Rabbi Julie Wolkoff as their interim, part-time Rabbi, making her the first woman rabbi in the Capital District. That summer she was joined by Rabbi Beverly W. Magidson, who was hired by Congregation Beth Shalom in Clifton Park. Rabbi Magidson was the first woman to ever head a Conservative synagogue.

Over the past 40 years the number of women rabbis and cantors has grown to a minyan, plus a few more in outlying areas, each one bringing the unique experience that women bring to their teaching of our tradition. On Monday, January 15, 2024, 11 women rabbis and cantors came together to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the arrival of the first female rabbi in the Capital District.
